



SHEV holders

Safe Haven Enterprise Visa – Western Australia

The Safe Haven Enterprise Visa (subclass 790) allows eligible illegal maritime arrivals to remain in Australia for five years.

A benefit of this visa is that if you meet the [SHEV pathway requirements](#), you may be eligible to apply for a prescribed substantive onshore visa (but not a permanent protection visa) at a later date.

One of the pathway requirements is that you work without accessing special benefit payments and/or study full time in a nominated regional area of Australia.

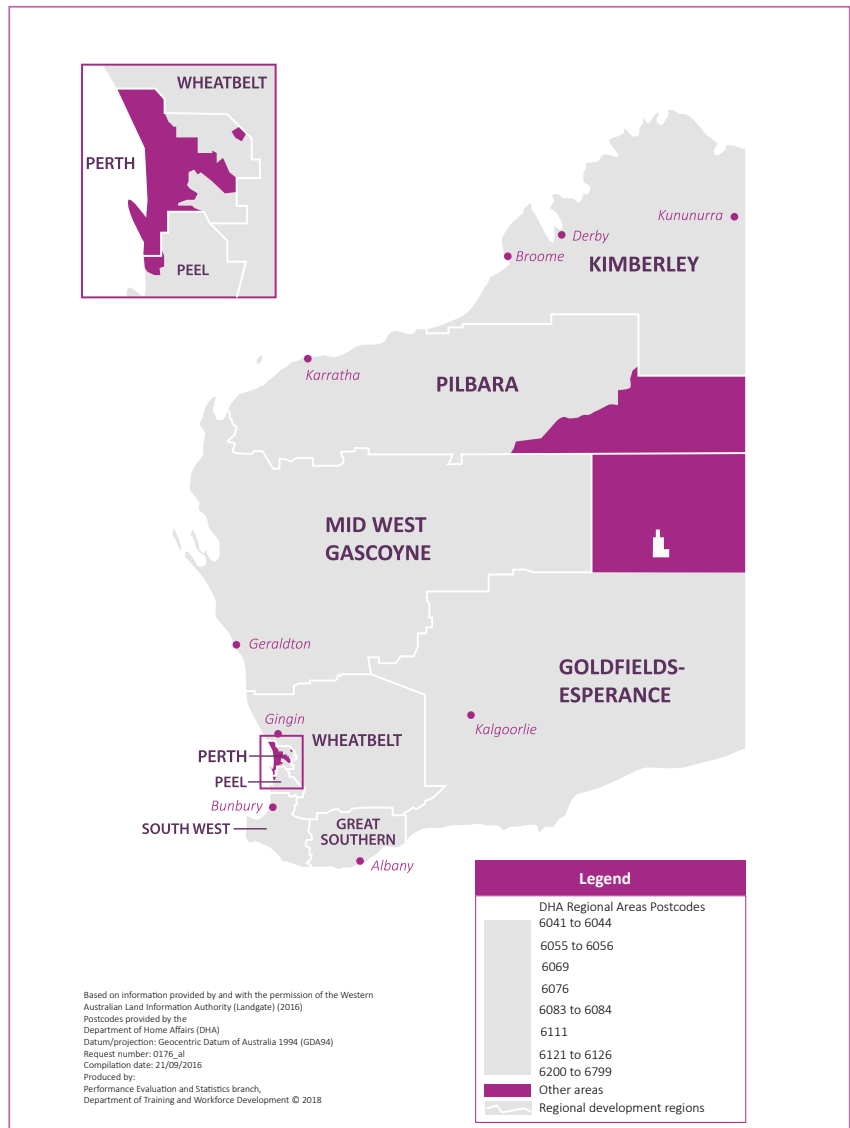
