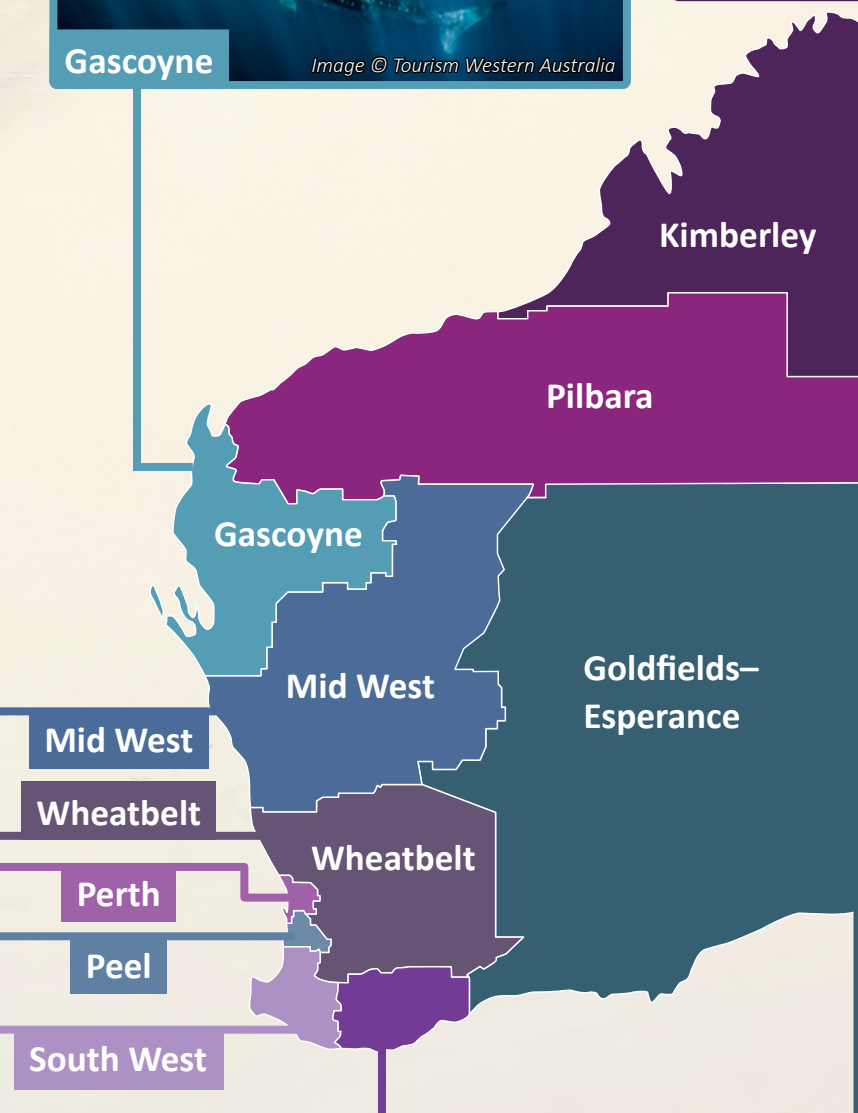
Situated in the southeastern corner of WA, Goldfields–Esperance is the largest region.

The Goldfields economy is based on gold and nickel processing, while further south near Esperance, wheat, canola and barley make up 80% of the agricultural economy.

## MIGRATION PATHWAYS TO WESTERN AUSTRALIA

Migration in Australia is made up of three streams: humanitarian, family and skilled. The stream suitable for you depends on many factors including your age, occupation and employment status.

## MIGRATION ADVICE

If you would like to appoint someone to provide immigration assistance, they must be either:

- ▷ a registered migration agent;
- ▷ a legal practitioner; or
- ▷ an exempt person.

# WESTERN AUSTRALIA'S BUILDING AND CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY IS THRIVING!

Strong economic growth and low unemployment rates are making skilled workforce needs a priority for the State Government.

## CONSTRUCTION VISA SUBSIDY PROGRAM

The Western Australian Government has invested \$11 million in the Construction Visa Subsidy Program (CVSP) to support skilled migration visa pathways to fill in-demand construction occupations.

The CVSP will provide grant payments of up to \$10,000 per skilled migrant, offsetting costs such as migration agent fees, visa application fees and relocation expenses.
